The students will work with Otolaryngology services including general otolaryngology, head & neck oncology, otology/rhinology, and pediatric otolaryngology in the diagnosis & treatment of head and neck disease. Patients include those with head and neck cancer, otologic disease, speech and hearing disorders, facial trauma, sinus disease, and infections of the head & neck. The student will become familiar with head and neck anatomy as it applies to each disease process. In addition to standard open surgical procedures, the student will be introduced to the ENT surgical techniques. Students will participate in Grand Rounds.
